FISH SPECIES AVAILABLE:



Largemouth Bass: The largest member of the sunfish family, they average 8-17 inches long and reach weights in excess of 10 pounds. Largemouth bass inhabit the warm weedy areas of lakes and ponds and will flourish in all but the very coldest ponds.



Yellow Perch: The yellow perch is the most widely distributed member of the perch family and generally grow to 6-12 inches long. Yellow perch will occupy a variety of habitat, but prefer weedy, protected section of lakes, rivers and ponds. They provide an excellent food source for larger predator fish such as largemouth bass.



Bluegill: The bluegill is a colorful fish that reaches 4-10 inches long. They thrive in warm, shallow ponds to the point where they over populate and their growth is stunted. Bluegill spawn throughout the summer, providing an abundance of small fish for bass to feed on.



Black Crappie: Black crappies grow to 6-12 inches long. Crappies prefer clear, quiet areas of lakes and ponds. They do very well in ponds that are stocked with bass. They provide a food supply for larger predator fish such as bass, and generally do not over populate when bass are present.



Fathead Minnows: Adult fathead minnows average 2-3 inches in length. The fathead's prolific nature will help to produce an abundant food supply for the game fish in your pond.



Triploid Grass Carp: The grass carp is the largest member of the minnow family, often reaching weights in excess of 25 pounds. Grass carp feed entirely on aquatic vegetation, and are commonly stocked in pond to control aquatic vegetation.

You are required to obtain a DEC permit before you can purchase and stock grass carp in your pond. Permits can be obtained at www.waynecountyNYsoilandwater.org

Triploid Grass Carp: The grass carp is one of the largest members of the minnow family, often reaching weights in excess of 25 pounds. Native to the rivers of eastern China, it has been introduced into over 50 countries due to its ability to control aquatic vegetation. Grass carp feed strictly by grazing on aquatic vegetation and do not share the bottom-feeding habits typical of common carp.

Triploid Grass Carp, which are sterile and incapable of producing viable young, are the only form of grass carp legal in NY due to concerns of the potential impact fertile grass carp could have on the ecosystem. Grass carp prefer submerged tender plant species such as elodea, coontail, fanwort, curly leaf pondweed and water milfoil. They will not control emergent plants such as cattail or bulrush or floating plant species such as water lily.

DEC permit is required before you can buy and stock grass carp in your pond. The permit form is available on our website or you can call our office and we can mail a copy. The permit should be completed and sent to DEC at least three weeks before our sale to ensure you receive your permit before our deadline.

What containers & water should I use to take home the fish? We recommend a large cooler or clean garbage can with lid filled with at least 15-20 gallons of water from your pond. Do not use chlorinated water to transport your fish. Bring at least 20 gallons of pond water for every 6 Grass Carp, 30 Catfish, 500 Minnows, 100 Bass or 100 Perch for a travel time of 30-45 minutes. Please bring a cover for the containers, so the water does not splash around and the fish do not jump or splash out. A garbage bag with a tie in the container works well.
